How does Esther prepare before approaching the King? What does this reveal about her character, strategy, and faith?

Why does Esther invite Xerxes and Haman to multiple banquets?

How does Esther change from the previous chapters? What's going on?

What/who enables her to stand up? Who is she standing up against?

How is Esther a model for us as Christ-followers?

Mordecai Sits

What is Mordecai doing in chapter 5? Why?

What does he NOT do? Why?

How has he changed from the previous chapters?

How is Mordecai a model for us as Christ-followers?

Haman Shakes

Trace Haman's attitude and emotions through the story. How do they change? What do they reveal?

How does Haman contrast with Esther and Mordecai?

How is Haman a warning to us as Christ-followers?
